## "What Did We Need SAVED From? Why is Our SALVATION So Glorious?" Luke 2:8-20; Matthew 10:34-39; Luke 14:25-27,33

"Ignorance, Indifference, and Ingratitude keep us from talking about our salvation. We must cultivate joy and thankfulness in our lives by growing in our knowledge of Christ." (Warren Wiersbe)

- An overview of Luke 2:8-20
  - The Lord revealed His salvation to the poor, the lowly, the unclean, the outcast, namely, the shepherds (1 Corinthians 1:26-29).
  - The last time the glory of the Lord came down among men, it was a very similar result (2 Chronicles 7:1-3).
  - Salvation is good news of great joy for all people. There is no greater news than the gospel.
    There is nothing more joyful than the gospel. Is that seen and heard in our lives?
  - The prophecies about the Messiah's first coming are being fulfilled right before their eyes. What an amazing grace that they are told about this glorious news!
  - The shepherds immediately act on their faith by doing what the angels had told them, go and see the Messiah!
  - o Mary treasured up the truths about Jesus in her heart. The Word of God was precious to her.
- What was I saved from? (Titus 2:11-14)
  - Salvation is *loud*. Salvation is *public*. Salvation is *an offense* to this world.
    - Salvation from the penalty of my sins or eternal damnation. This should never grow old as we passionately celebrate this reality. "They will suffer the punishment of eternal destruction, away from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His might." (2 Thessalonians 1:9)
    - Salvation from being a slave to my sin. I now can put to death what is earthly in me, or my sin. "Since we have these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from every defilement of body and spirit...." (2 Corinthians 7:1a)
    - Salvation to live a holy life that is distinct in every way from the way that the world lives. "Bringing holiness to completion in the fear of God." (2 Corinthians 7:1b)
    - Salvation to be a slave to Christ and to live to please Him and Him alone. "So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please Him." (2 Corinthians 5:9)
    - Salvation to exalt the supremacy of Christ's wisdom over all other ways of living. "For to set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God's law; indeed it cannot. Those who are in the flesh cannot please God." (Romans 8:6-8)
