What it Means to Work With God

2 Corinthians 6:1-10

In order to glorify God in the work He has given us to do, we need to remember that it is a **privilege** to be able to work for him. A privilege is a "special honor given to someone". This is not based on our merit, but on His grace. (1 Timothy 1:12-16)

The Foundation of Our Work - 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

- Vs. 17: Before you were saved, you were a child of wrath, and your Father was not God, but was Satan. Once saved, you become a child of God! (John 8:44) (John 1:12)
- Vs. 18: We have been given the ministry of reconciliation
- Vs.19: We have been entrusted with the message of reconciliation
- Vs.20: We are now Ambassadors for Christ. We represent Him in how we both speak and act.

The Task at Hand - 2 Corinthians 6:1-3

We work *together with God*, a partnership with Him. Because of this we are never helpless or alone. "I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matt 28:20)

Two types of appeals: 1. To the lost (Acts 4:12) 2. To genuine believers who are not living as they ought to be. (1 Cor 15:10-11).

"We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry". - We ought to be living in such a way that gives credibility to the gospel, not bring shame to it. (Phil 1:27, 1 Cor 9:25-27)

The Troubles and Tools of Ministry - 2 Corinthians 6:4-7

As believers, we may experience troubles while we are working for God. Paul lists 9 difficult or "negative" experiences he had to endure. This endurance is more than just "hanging on". It is a <u>triumphal patience</u>, associated elsewhere in scripture with Tribulation (Rom 5:3), Faith (James 1:3) Hope (1 Thess 1:3), Joy (Col 1:11) and Future Glory (Romans 2:7 + 8:25). Endurance through trial is an amazing testimony!

He also lists 9 "positives" as well. **Purity** (1 Tim 1:5), **Knowledge** (Col 1:9), **Patience and Kindness** (2 Tim 2:24-26) **Holy Spirit** (1 Cor 12:11) **Genuine Love** (1 John 4:19) **Truthful Speech** (1 Pet 3:15), **The Power of God** (Rom 1:16), **Weapons of Righteousness** (2 Cor 10:3-5)

The Paradoxes of Ministry - 2 Corinthians 6:8-10

Each one of these paradoxes have a reality for this life, as well as one for eternity. Honor and Dishonor, Slander and Praise (John 15:18), Impostors, yet True (John 7:12), Unknown, yet Well Known (1 Cor 8:3), Dying, yet Living - Punished, yet Not Killed (2 Cor 4:10-12) Poor, yet Making Many Rich - Having Nothing, yet Possessing Everything (1 Pet 1:4), Sorrowful, But Always Rejoicing (John 16:33)

"Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord, your labor is never in vain" - 1 Corinthians 15:58
