Planning vs. Presumption James 4:13-17

Planning is a good thing. God has given us minds in order to make real decisions: "The plans of the diligent surely lead to abundance, but everyone who is hasty only leads to poverty" Proverbs 21:5. But there is a temptation to become *self-sufficient* and elevate *our will* above God's will. (James 4:13)

- Logically thinking through a plan does not mean you are living in God's will!
- Watch out for "I will" statements!
- Instead we ought to say: "If the Lord wills" (Vs. 15)

The Sin of Presumption and Arrogance

"To presume something is to not have all the information, yet to have confidence as if you know the outcome. This is *arrogance* (**James 4:16**). Presumptive arrogance is the same temptation Satan fell into (**Isa 14:12-14**)

Three pitfalls to avoid:

- 1. Living as if God doesn't exist when we make our plans (Practical Atheism)
- 2. Knowing God's will and arrogantly doing what we want to do anyways (Self-Theism)
- 3. Trying to make God's will *conform to our own*. (1 Sam 15:2-3, 7-9, 12-21)

James warns us that we live presumptuously when we don't consider the brevity of our life: "Yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring, what is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes" (James 4:14)

- Plans are fragile, and God alone is the one that allows them to be accomplished
- Our minds (rationally and intellectually thinking through our plans) have the capacity to lead us astray (**Prov 19:21**)
- Our hearts (plans made from our passions and desires) also have the capacity to lead us astray (Prov 16:9)

"Passions are meant to be governed and guided by our minds, and our minds were meant to be governed and guided by God. God over mind, mind over passions" - Joe Rigney

The Cure for Presumption

- Live with eternity on our minds: **Psalm 90:12** "So teach us to number our days, that we may get a heart of wisdom"
- Humble yourself, and recognize God is in control, not you (Dan 4:30-33,36-37)
- Consider God first in our plans (1 Chron 29:10-18, James 4:15,17)

Utilize the means in which God has given you to discern His will. He has given you His Word (2 Tim 3:16-17), Prayer in order to ask for wisdom (James 1:5-8) and leaders who are able to guide you and give you counsel (Prov 15:22, Heb 13:7,17).
