"The God of Grace and Compassion" Luke 9:1-9; Mark 6:7-13; Matthew 10:1-15

"When He saw the crowds, *He had compassion for them*, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd" (Matthew 9:36). "When He went ashore He saw a great crowd, and *He had compassion on them* and healed their sick" (Matthew 14:14). "Then Jesus called His disciples to Him and said, *'I have compassion* on the crowd because they have been with Me now three days and have nothing to eat. And I am unwilling to send them away hungry, lest they faint on the way" (Matthew 15:32). "Come to Me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you, and learn from Me, for *I am gentle and lowly in heart*, and you will find *rest for your souls*. For My yoke is easy, and My burden is light" (Matthew 11:28-30).

- "**He called** the twelve together...."
 - After spending all night in prayer *Jesus chose* these 12 from among the disciples and called them Apostles (Luke 6:12-16; Acts 1:20-26).
 - Jesus sent them out two by two; this included Judas (Mark 6:7).
- "He gave them power and authority...."
 - He gave them authority to heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, and cast out demons (Matthew 10:8).
 - The Scriptures teach us that **God reigns** and has absolute control over all things (Luke 8:22-56). God ruling over all things is meant to give us **stability**, **strength**, **courage**, and **boldness**, as we go through life.
 - "We as Christians should hate all suffering, especially eternal suffering." (John Piper)
 - It has always been "normal" for physicians, exorcists, and those with special spiritual powers to charge for their services; Jesus told His disciples to reject that practice (Matthew 10:8) and to give freely as they have been given.
- "He sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal."
 - "Jesus *instructed* them....": An order that required unhesitating and unqualified obedience.
 (Matthew 10:5)
 - The **Kingdom of God** is understood in at least three ways:
 - The **spiritual rule** of God in our lives through repentance (Mark 6:12).
 - The **Sovereign rule** of God over all things (Matthew 10:7-8).
 - The **physical rule** of Christ during His Millennial Reign.
 - "But go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel": Christ was the Messiah Israel had been looking for. He proved to them He was the Messiah, few accepted, and as a Nation they rejected Him (Matthew 23:37-39).
- "He said to them, 'Take nothing for your journey...."
 - Jesus was teaching them and preparing them to trust His sufficiency and His faithfulness to meet their needs, "for the laborer deserves his food" (Matthew 10:10; Luke 22:35; 1 Timothy 5:17-19; Philippians 4:11-13,19).
 - "Shake off the dust from your feet": It was a sign of condemnation to those you are departing from, a shaking off of the contamination of being in that place.
 - "It will be more bearable on the day of judgment for the land of Sodom and Gomorrah than for that town." (Matthew 10:15; cf. Luke 12:47-48)
