"Do This in Remembrance of Me: The Grace of Remembrance" 1 Corinthians 11:23-31

Nothing is more costly to forget than to forget God. No one is more important to honor than to honor God.

- The Biblical Worldview of Remembrance:
 - "I will remember the deeds of the LORD; yes, I will remember Your wonders of old. I will ponder all Your work, and meditate on Your mighty deeds." (Psalm 77:11-12)
 - "You shall remember" that you were a slave in Egypt.... (Deuteronomy 5:15)
 - "You shall remember" what God did to Pharaoh and Egypt.... (Deuteronomy 7:18)
 - "You shall remember" how God led you through the wilderness.... (Deuteronomy 8:2)
 - "You shall remember" that God gives us the power to get wealth.... (Deuteronomy 8:18)
 - "You shall remember" how you provoked the LORD to wrath.... (Deuteronomy 9:7)
 - "You shall remember" the LORD your God redeemed you.... (Deuteronomy 15:15)
 - "Remember the days of old; consider the years of many generations...." (Deuteronomy 32:7)
- The Biblical Benefits of Rememberance:
 - Remembering should be weighty, serious, and incredibly joyful.
 - o Remembering is intellectual, emotional, and life changing and recalibrating.
 - o Remembering is the kindling for the fire of zeal, love, and thankfulness.
- What should we remember when we take Communion?
 - **We remember** that God has made it clear how He desires to be worshipped. "God is spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth." (John 4:24)
 - **We remember** our sins are forgiven because Christ died for us. "In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses…" (Ephesians 1:7)
 - We remember that in Christ we have fellowship with God and one another. "The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body..." (1 Corinthians 10:16b-17a)
 - **We remember** the need of repentance and the work of sanctification. "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9)
 - We remember that Jesus is coming again, and when He does, we will be glorified. "We await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like His glorious body...." (Philippians 3:20b-21a)
 - **We remember** that access to God is both joyful and serious. "Let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire." (Hebrews 12:28b-29). "Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need." (Hebrews 4:16)
 - **We remember** our responsibility to proclaim the Lord's death. "That you may proclaim the excellencies of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light." (1 Peter 2:9b)
