The Narrow Door Luke 13:22-30

Continuation of Christ's journey from Luke 9:51 - As He was making his way towards Jerusalem, He was teaching and preaching in small towns and villages, knowing full well He was on His way to die. "Making the best use of the time, because the days are evil." (Eph 5:16)

"Lord, will those who are saved be few?" - The better question is, will I be one of them?

Personal Responsibility

"I am the door, if anyone enters by me, he will be saved and go in and out and find pasture." John 10:9. Jesus is saying that following Him comes with a heavy cost (Luke 9:57-58) and there are many who are following Him for the wrong reasons (Matt 7:13-14).

The Christian must overcome many tribulations before they enter the Kingdom of God. (Acts 14:22)

- "I have fought (Greek: agonizomai) the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." 2 Timothy 4:7. Paul took responsibility for his fight to endure. He wasn't suggesting that he endured in his own strength, but he did not separate from his responsibility to endure. (1 Cor 15:10)
- Christ must be chosen above all else. (Luke 14:25-27, Matt 13:18-22)

The door is "narrow" in one sense because each individual must pass through it on their own. No one is saved as a "group" or gets to "slip in" on the coattails of someone else's faith.

Vs. 25-27

If you are lost, you are living on borrowed time! (Luke 12:20-21). You never know when your time is coming. Our lives are "a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes" (James 4:13-14). We ought to live is the way the Psalmist says in Ps. 90:14 - "So teach us to number our days so that we may get a heart of wisdom."

- Vs. 25: There are many people who will be surprised that the Lord will not accept them into His kingdom. There are many who value religion, or who go through the motions, but their heart is far from God. (Isaiah 29:13)
- 26-27: Jesus taught in Israel for 3 years. They were "familiar" with Jesus. But familiarity doesn't save you. (Matthew 7:21-23).

Vs. 28-30

The Jewish people thought that because they were physical descendants of Abraham that they were in good standing with God. But being a physical descendant does not mean you are saved spiritually. (Gal 3:28-29). All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23)

- There will be a day in the future when the house of Israel will be saved, but it will be done by each individual repenting and putting their faith in Christ. (Luke 13:34-35)
- Vs.30 shows a reversal of expectations. The last will be first: Gentiles, who were looked down on, will be saved. They are on equal footing with the Jewish believers!
