"The Christian Work Ethic: For Me to Live is Christ" (Part 6) Philippians 1:20-26

"(Jesus) gave Himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession who are zealous for good works." (Titus 2:14). "Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord." (Romans 12:11). "So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please (Christ)." (2 Corinthians 5:9). "But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires." (Romans 13:14)

- Philippians 1:20-26:
 - o "As it is my eager anticipation and hope": This is Paul's longing, his passion, his zeal.
 - "Christ will be honored in my body": Paul wanted Christ to be magnified, glorified, and made much of in his life.
 - "Whether by life or by death": In Paul's living and in his dying, his one aim was that Christ would be honored. Wow!
 - "But I do not account my life of any value nor as precious to myself...." (Acts 20:24). "Even if I am to be poured out as a drink offering...." (Philippians 2:17). "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me." (Galatians 2:20). "You are not your own, for you were bought with a price." (1 Corinthians 6:19-20)
 - "For to me to live is Christ": Paul is Christ's servant, with the sole purpose of glorifying Christ's name.
 - "That means fruitful labor for me" If Paul is alive he is producing fruit.
 - "By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be My disciples." (John 15:8)
 - Salvation (Romans 1:13) and Sanctification (Romans 7:4).
 - "But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account": Paul lived to help people grow in Christ.
 - "I will remain and continue with you all, for your progress and joy in the faith" "your progress": advancing despite difficulties and obstacles.
 - "But we work with you for your joy, for you stand firm in your faith."
 (2 Corinthians 1:24; cf. Colossians 1:28-29)
 - "For me to die is gain": When we die we lose all our earthly comforts, joys, and possessions but we gain Christ gain.
 - "My desire is to depart (to be untied or set free) and be with Christ, for that is far better":
 If I think to die is gain, Christ is honored. We are saying He is better than anything this life can offer.
 - So that in me you may have ample cause to glory in Christ Jesus": Paul wanted Christ to be glorified in this life and in the life to come.
 - "So that the tested genuineness of your faith more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ." (1 Peter 1:7)
